A quorum was established and minutes were approved as written.

## **Reports**

Alderman Mark Billingsley report – March 23 the BMA met and approved a beer permit for the Germantown Festival for September 12 and 13. The ordinance passed in a 4 to 1 vote on the third and final reading regarding how board chairmen of the City's commissions are selected. In the future, the Aldermen will select the chairmen of the commissions. April 13 will be the last board meeting held at 7 p.m. All future BMA meetings will start at 6 p.m. The Executive session will no longer take place. All staff input and discussion will now take place at the meetings. GHS will also alter its viewing time to 6 p.m. Alderman Billingsley is hopeful that someday Germantown will have its own radio station. The BMA will be working with Germantown High School to lobby for the station. The HVAC has been replaced at the Animal Shelter and Public Services and other places in Germantown. New Swat team vests were also approved. Alive at 25 civic support was approved for both high schools. Improvements to the off leash dog area will be discussed at the next BMA meeting. The park will not be closed however there will be a small fee for the park usage and a card will be issued. The park will be closed during inclement weather.

The question was raised to guns in the parks. Alderman Billingsley stated that the BMA opposed guns in Germantown Parks; the current bill would give municipalities the right to either choose to carry a handgun in a park or choose not to. It may be appropriate to have a handgun in some rural parks in Tennessee.

The question was raised about gated community. Alderman Billingsley stated that Garner Woods Cove had gone to the Planning Commission to ask for a gate for their new subdivision. Alderman Billingsley will get the ordinance and send it out to the commission.

Neighborhood Services report – Joe Nunes reported that next weekend is the semiannual Amnesty Dumpster Day (ADD). If you are swapping out a TV for the change in analog, make sure that you do not throw it away, recycle it. You may bring one to ADD to be recycled. The Beatification Commission will be having their Spring Spruce Up on April 25. David Jackson asked to have the information emailed to him and wanted to know what all it involved. The neighborhood decides what they want to do. All over Germantown there will be cleaning up and

picking up. On Monday nights BMA meeting, BankTennessee will be recognized for their donation.

**Planning Commission** – Joe Nunes reported that there was an article in the newspaper regarding Saddle Creek IV and the final outline plan approval

**CONA Report** –Billy Brown reported that David Pickler was the speaker at the last meeting and did a great job. He fielded questions and spoke for almost an hour. The program for next meeting has not been set as of yet. There will be a board meeting next week and the agenda will be set at that time.

**Environmental Commission Report** – Sandra reported that she was unable to go to the last meeting. This commission is very active and always looking for great ways for keeping the environment safe. Joe also had to leave early from the meeting for another meeting.

**Tree Board Report** – Sidney reported that there will be a meeting next Tuesday. The board received a \$17,000 grant from the State for a forestry working for the City inventorying the trees in Germantown, the type, condition and a dollar value.

It was also discussed to help Germantown businesses to put together a Germantown coupon book to help during this economic downturn time that could be handed out during the DOC.
