Public Hearing - Ordinance 2014-9 - Increase Salary of City Judges - Second Reading

INTRODUCTION:

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen is asked to consider on second reading an ordinance amendment to increase the salaries of our two elected City judges.

BACKGROUND:

Prior to April 19, 1993 City judges in Germantown were appointed by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen. In 1993 state law mandated that municipal judges be elected at large from the jurisdiction they serve and that the term of office be eight years in duration. Our two City judges hear mostly state cases including traffic violations and local ordinance violations.

DISCUSSION:

The City's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 2, identifies the establishment of a judicial department. Compensation for the City judges is also contained within this section of the code, therefore any adjustment must be made by amending the ordinance through the three reading process. The ordinance attached to this agenda sheet accomplishes this goal and will increase the judges' annual salary to \$35,000 effective immediately upon taking office after the election for City Judges in August 2014, and will adjust their salaries again to \$40,000 beginning August 1, 2018.

VISION 2020:

The City is financially sound and well governed. The City provides exceptional services through a professional and competitively compensated workforce.

INTRODUCTION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to approve payment to the Germantown Performing Arts Center ("GPAC") of funds collected for rental and leases of the Germantown Performing Arts Center for a twelve month period in excess of the \$120,000.00

BACKGROUND:

The Germantown Community Foundation was established as a 501(c)(3) not for profit corporation in November 1985. The purpose of the Foundation was to raise funds for the completion of the Germantown Center and Theatre. Over time their focus shifted to that of the primary fund raising arm of GPAC. In recognition of this change and direction, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen in June 1998 approved an agreement with the Germantown Community Foundation creating a new understanding of responsibilities for the operation of GPAC. Under this agreement established in 1998, the Foundation would be responsible for all of the operating costs associated with overhead, salaries and benefits for GPAC staff. In January 2005, after considerable change in the administration and the GPAC Board, the City and GPAC Board felt that a new operating agreement was in order, and the parties entered into the Cooperative Performing Arts Agreement dated January 10, 2005. The Agreement was subsequently amended by Amendment No. 1 dated June 8, 2009 and Amendment No. 2 dated June 30, 2011.

DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to Amendment No. 2 to the Cooperative Performing Arts Agreement, subject to the annual written approval of the City and GPAC, GPAC will receive all funds collected from leases or rentals of the center during each twelve months beginning on July 1 and ending on June 30. The City chose not to act upon Amendment No. 2 and per Amendment No.2 section 2. 4b "If, however, prior to the end of any such twelve month period, the provisions of this Amendment No. 2 are not extended by written consent of both parties hereto, the following language of Section 4 b. of the Agreement as set forth in Amendment No. 1 shall be reinstated in the Agreement."

Per Amendment No. 1 "The City will receive all funds collected form leases or rentals of the Centre up to \$120,000 during each twelve month period beginning on July 1 and ending on June 30, and GPAC will receive any funds in excess of \$120,000 collected from such leases or rentals during said twelve month period.

This action is consistent with the vision 2020 and mission of our City by effectively using boards and commissions in the governance process.

INTRODUCTION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to request authorization for payment to the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (Division of Water Supply) in the amount of \$18,141.50 for the State Facility Maintenance Fee as established by the Water Quality Control Board.

BACKGROUND:

This fee provides funding for a technical staff which consults with local utility officials on water system issues and is collected from all public water systems in the State of Tennessee. The fee is based upon the type of facility and the number of water service connections and was implemented by the State in 1991 and amended by the Water Quality Control Board on July 22, 1992. (Rule 1200-5-1.32).

DISCUSSION:

The City of Germantown qualifies as a community water system with the maintenance fee based upon the number of service connections (13,955 units @ \$1.30 each). The last increase was approved by the state in February of 2008.

INTRODUCTION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to extend the dedication of property agreement with the Germantown Veterans Recognition Committee. The City property is a portion of Municipal Square that will be a place of remembrance and education to be designed, constructed, and located between the Germantown Community Library and the Kiwanis Pavilion in an area that currently serves as a plaza.

BACKGROUND:

The Board of Mayor and Alderman initially approved the dedication of City property on February 13, 2012. DISCUSSION:

INTRODUCTION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to request authorization for the Mayor to execute a Contract Renewal Agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey in the amount of \$11,200.00.

BACKGROUND:

The Annual USGS Agreement provides the equipment and expertise necessary to monitor, record, sample and report on the conditions and any changes in the City's two well fields. The agreement begins July 1, 2014 and ends June 30, 2015. The results of work under this agreement will be available for publication by the U.S. Geological Survey.

DISCUSSION:

The information derived from the USGS is beneficial in planning for the future development of the well fields as well as continued management and use of our existing system. Continual aquifer level and water quality monitoring from observation wells in both the Southern Avenue and Johnson Road well fields provides the information to detect any changes in quality or volume in a timely manner. Services include an in depth chemical analysis of water samples collected at both well fields. All the reports are examined quarterly by staff to analyze trends and the operational objective to monitor water system availability for our customers.

RECOGNITION OF DONATIONS TO FIRE DEPARTMENT

INTRODUCTION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to accept equipment provided to the Germantown Fire Department from a FY-2011 Office of Homeland Security Grant in the amount of \$1,511.75; to accept equipment from the Metropolitan Medical Response System in the amount of \$73,975.00; and to approve budget adjustments 14-147 and 15-05, respectively.

BACKGROUND:

The Shelby County Office of Preparedness received a Grant from Department of Homeland Security entitled the FY-2011 Homeland Security Grant. The Office of Preparedness purchased five (5) Multi-Rae Chargers at a cost of \$272.10 each and five (5) Automotive Charging Adapters for a cost of \$30.25 each for total cost of \$1,511.75. We received these items on June 19, 2014.

The Memphis Fire Department processed a Metropolitan Medical Response System Grant offered by the Department of Homeland Security for equipment to respond to medical emergencies in this region. A portion of the funds (\$73,975.00) were used to purchase a 2014 Medstat MS 500 Mini Ambulance. It will be used to respond to incidents and staff events when appropriate, as well as be available for regional response if needed.

DISCUSSION:

These Vehicle Chargers will be used with Multi-Rae Gas detectors purchased in a previous Grant. Prior to receiving these chargers, the gas detectors could only be charged in the fire stations limiting the availability of the equipment. The purchasing of these items was handled by the Shelby County purchasing department and delivered to the Shelby County Office of Preparedness Purchasing. We received these items from the Shelby County Office of Preparedness on June 19, 2014. Budget Adjustment 14-147 was created to recognize the donation.

This Mini Ambulance will be used to respond to medical emergencies in areas that can not be easily reached by normal vehicles. It is to be used in conjunction to medical needs in this region as part of the Metropolitan Medical Response System guidelines. The purchasing of this item was handled by the City of Memphis purchasing department and delivered to the Memphis Fire Department. We received this item from the Memphis Fire Department on July 18, 2014. Budget Adjustment 15-05 recognizes the donation.
