REPORTS

Police

The Police Department will soon be implementing a 7th district.

4 new officers will be at the academy and 3 of the 4 are already POST certified. Lt. Jones will be teaching EVOG at the academy.

Police Reserve Dinner will be February 19th.

CPA will start February 18th and applications will be accepted until February 11th.

Reserve Academy will be March 24th - June 23rd. All reserves will be POST certified.

Safety City planning and preparations need to begin. Al Gabriel will speak with Josh Cathy about the use of Farmington Elementary again. Safety City will be June 13th - 17th.

Drug Take Back will be April 30, 2016 and will be held at 2 different locations.

The 911 locator signs have been put up on the first section of the Greenway. Once all the signs have been completed, a media announcement will go out.

Fire

The Fire Department recently trained 750 students at Germantown High School in CPR.

Germantown Athletic Club is in the middle of renovations.

Riverdale, Houston High School and Germantown High School have all entered proposals for renovations.

BMA

The BMA had their retreat on January 29th.

Stony River had a successful opening. Tazikis will have their opening/ribbon cutting on February 2nd.

The BMA has eliminated the Germantown Rd realignment for now, but will continue to work on the infrastructure of the area.

A master plan study will be conducted for the Forest Hill/Winchester area, while looking at widening or the restructuring of Forest Hill Irene.

The Executive Director of the Germantown Education Foundation, Stephanie Brockway was introduced.

The Germantown Education Foundation supports our 5 schools. Celebration of the 10 year anniversary of the Germantown Education Foundation had begun with "Fill the Fountain" campaign. The Foundation and Germantown Municipal Schools have partnered in the First Annual "GMSD 5K Stampede & Color Run" Race for Education, April 24th, 2016.
