These actions were taken in response to Governor Bill Lee's Executive Order No. 60, an order extending Executive Order No. 16, previously extended by Page 2 Executive Order No. 34, previously extended by Executive Order No. 51, which suspended the requirements of the Tennessee Open Meetings Act to the extent necessary to allow governing bodies subject to the act to meet and conduct essential business by electronic means.
