2021 Senior Expo:

The Commission continued to discuss the upcoming Senior Expo. Senior Expo has been scheduled for Thursday, October 21st, set up and Wednesday, October 20th at the Great Hall. Chairman Debo reported that exhibitors from 2yrs ago have been notified that there will be 52 vendor booths and a dance floor. Vendor registration has been slow to date due to Covid-19 concerns. The Commission discussed postponing the Senior Expo until spring of 2022.

2022 Senior Expo:

The Commission discussed the date for the 2022 Senior Expo that will be the first Thursday in November.

Senior Survey Subcommittee Report - Brandy Miller:

The Commission discussed the data that was collected from attendees of the Spring Seminar held on June, 17, 2021. In total, 51 surveys were completed. This survey report was emailed to all Commission Members. Deborah Edwards requested a senior subcommittee be formed to create the annual senior citizen policy agenda for review by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen, as specified in city code section 2-285. Director Beasley informed the members that the Senior Advisory Commission does not have policy making authority. She went on to say that staff will submit a 2021 Commission annual report to the Board of Mayor and Alderman in December. Then in January, the Commission will put together the 2022 work plan which will include goals and action items for the calendar year.

Reports:

Parks and Recreation Director - Pam Beasley:

Director Beasley discussed the future expansions, improvements and opportunities in the city and she gave presentation on "Age Friendly Communities". The last censes model shows that Germantown has a senior population of 21.5%. 1 in every 3 americans are over the age of 50 and by 2030 1 out of every 5 will be 65 years old or older.

The goal is to have an "age friendly community". A "age friendly community" focus is on walk ability, outdoor spaces and indoor gathering spaces, activities, healthcare services, civic and social participation, communication and information and social inclusion for all. The Senior Advisory Commission will embrace the term "age friendly community" by applying with AARP to be certified as an "age friendly community". Director Beasley reported that the staff will create a plan to collect data to complete a formal compressive needs assessment report with assistance from community outreach. The compressive needs assessment report is designed to better understand the needs of older adults in our community.

Recreation Service Manager - Natalie Ruffin

Natalie shared with the commission the upcoming and current senior programs.

Alderman Liaison – Sherrie Hicks

Alderman Hicks reported on the state of the City as well as the most current Covid-19 updates.
